The Hildegard Messenbaugh Award

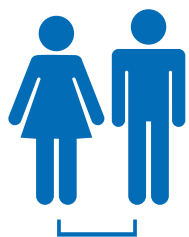

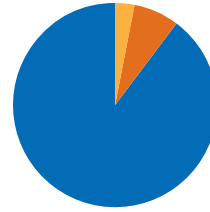

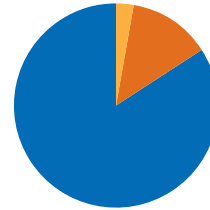

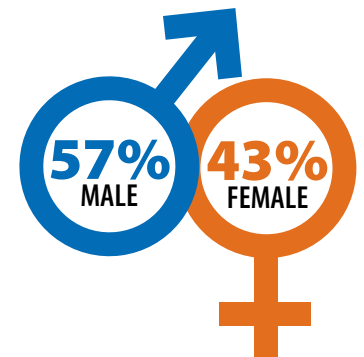
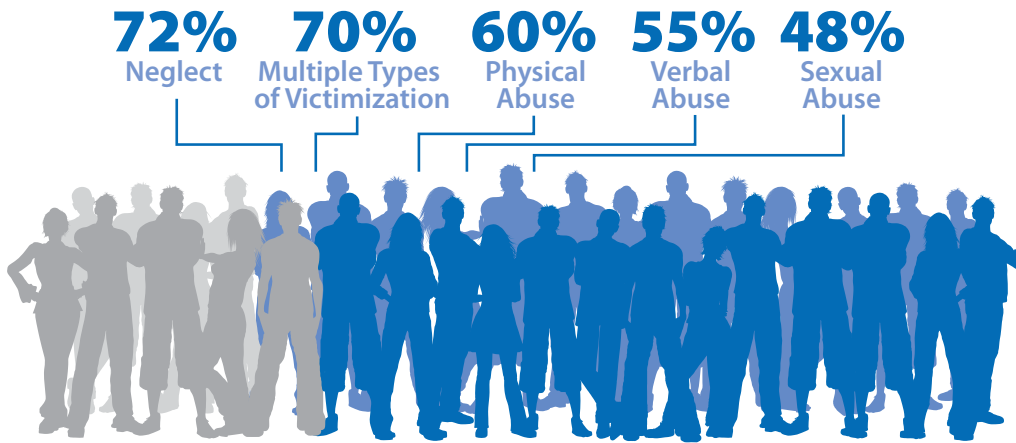

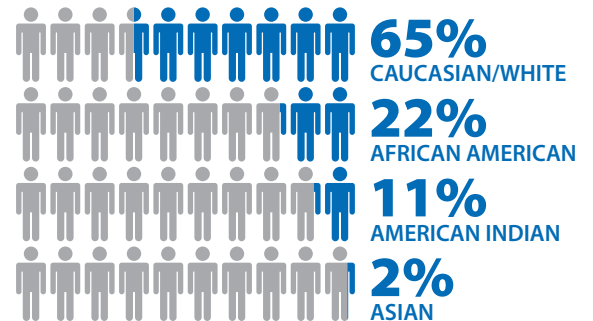
